

Dear High School Families,

On Monday, April 12th all high school students will return to daily in-person classes. Teachers will be welcoming all students back to full-time daily in-person learning. Only students with medical documentation and previously identified as vulnerable will continue learning at home.

While the synchronized or home learning component is being replaced by daily face-to-face learning, students should continue to bring their devices to support their in-class learning. Teachers will continue to use the new platforms and tools so that in the event of a school closure due to an outbreak, classes can be offered on-line for all students.

High School Operational Plans will be updated to reflect changes that will be in place when students return to in-person learning on April 12th, 2021. This includes all staff and students wearing masks except when eating or while engaged in physical activity, teachers having a consistent seating plan for each class, drivers having a seating plan for each of their bus runs, and additional spaces being identified for students to use at noon and during breaks.
