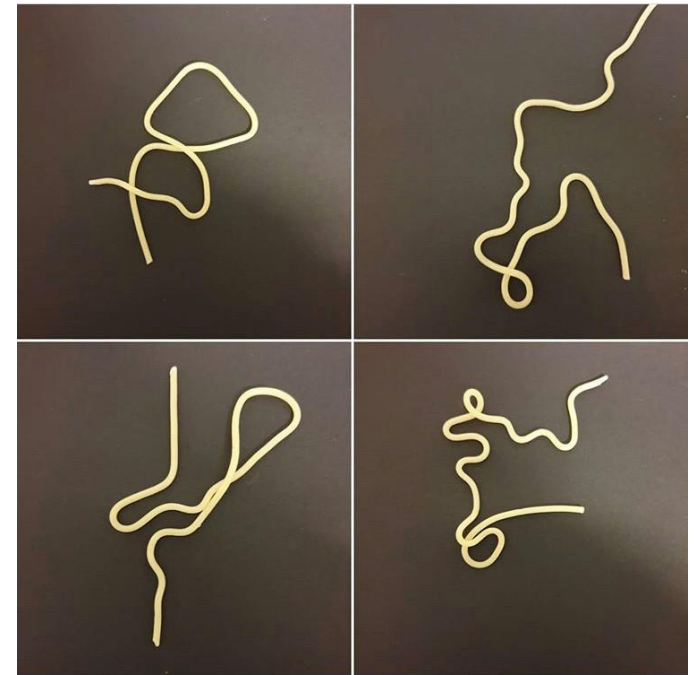

Oil Spill Experiment	Bird Blitz at Home
<p>An oil spill can happen on the ocean when a ship carrying big containers of petroleum oil starts to leak. Or if an oil drilling rig malfunctions, as with the 2010 Deepwater Horizon accident off the coast of Louisiana. Oil spills can also affect our rivers and other freshwater. If an oil pipeline that travels over land springs a leak, the oil can find its way into the local waterways and groundwater. Oil can also get into our rivers and waterways through stormwater. Spilled oil sticks to the fur and feathers of birds and animals that live on or near the water and is hard to remove. That is why animals are so affected by oil spills.</p> <p>In this activity, you will build a simple model of a river habitat (complete with “birds”, “mammals” and “plants”) and then create an oil spill.
