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## PSSC K-5 Principal's Report – February 12, 2018

K-5 Enrolment – 268

OurSCHOOL Survey – 82 grade 4 and 5 students

### Areas of Strength:

- Increase in student participation in school sports and clubs. Increase could be due to enrichment activities for 3-5 held 1 hour per week for approximately 5 weeks prior to Christmas.
- Students have friends they can trust and who encourage them to make positive choices.
- Students are interested and motivated in their learning.

### Areas in Need of Improvement

- 71% of students feel accepted and valued by their peers versus the Canadian norm of 86%.
- 82% of students believe they have positive behaviour at school versus the Canadian norm of 91%.
- 42% of students were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month versus the Canadian norm of 28%.
- Students rated the disciplinary climate of the classroom 6.9/10 versus the Canadian norm or 7.6/10.
