



Tantramar Regional High School – Bring Your Own Device Policy

Introduction – **BYOD- “Bring Your Own Device”** in the K-12 context refers to a program in which students can use their own personal wireless devices to support their LEARNING in school and during the instructional day. This includes connecting to the Internet via the school wireless network.

Definitions

- Personal electronic devices: Tablet devices such as the iPad or Android tablets, Netbook and Laptop computers, Smart Phones with Wi-Fi capacity, iPhone, Blackberry, Android, iPod Touch, etc.
- School Wi-Fi: NB Education wireless network
- Acceptable Use Policy: school-based and provincial-based policies that establish rules and guidelines for the acceptable use of technology in the K-12 school system

TRHS BYOD-“Bring Your Own Device” Rules & Guidelines

- The use of personal electronic devices during the instructional day is to support student learning and educational activities; personal use is NOT permitted during instructional time
- The use of personal electronic devices in the classroom is at the discretion of teachers and the school administration
- Personal electronic device use at school must not disrupt the learning of others
- Inappropriate use of personal electronic devices during the instructional day may result in loss of privileges. In extreme circumstances, devices may be subject to search & seizure
- Anglophone East School District and Tantramar Regional High School is not responsible for damaged, lost or stolen devices that students use in the BYOD initiative
- Access to school Wi-Fi is provided; this does not include access to NBED resources such as user drives, etc.
- District Technicians are not responsible for setup, maintenance and repair to personal devices involved in this BYOD initiative
- Failure to abide by this policy may result in loss of BYOD privileges
