Attention Parents Who Drop Off their Children

I have witnessed and had reports from bus drivers of a few major traffic violations during the morning drop off time. Some drivers exit the main school parking/drop off area onto school street. This exit (added 3 years ago) is an exit only! It requires the driver to turn left during

STOP THINK OBSERVE PROCEED bussing times since there is signage that does not allow any motor vehicle, other than buses, to go into the bus drop off and loading parking lot. This past week a blue Honda Accord and a Burgandy Dodge Truck went through this area. When buses are in this area and they have the Red Flashing lights on, you are "passing a school bus with red lights on." The fine for this driving violation exceeds \$800 dollars and the loss of 5 points. The other

violation is parking on Duke St. and leaving the vehicle to take your child into the school. Duke St. is a town street that is clearly marked with no parking signs. There are lots of spaces in our parking lot! Use those and role model the right way to park with your child. We have asked the RCMP to monitor these situations in the AM whenever possible.

SES Snack of the Week Program

Although the program will be setup the same as the "snack of the week" initiative that we ran before Christmas, the reward component will be based on class participation. The class with the highest participation percentage will receive a complete day of healthy eating. Recess snacks will be fruit trays and juice. Lunch will include a sub or pizza lunch (class choice) served with milk or juice.

Each day classes will submit the snack totals for the class to the office and these numbers will be calculated into percentages. The standings will be posted at the end of each week and reviewed on the Monday AM announcements. An example of a class participating would be;

21 students in class A. During the first week (5 days in total) of the program the students bring the snack of the week with the following ratios;

Monday - 12 of 21 students bring the snack of the week. 57% Tuesday - 15 of 21 students bring the snack of the week. 71%

Wednesday - 14 out of 19 bring the snack of the week. (2 absent) **74%** Thursday - 17 out of 20 bring the snack of the week. (1 absent) **85%** Friday - 13 out of 17 bring the snack of the week. (4 absent) **77%**

Average participation rate at the end of week 1 = 72.8%

Week 1 (March 10-14) - Grapes Week 2 (March 17-21) - Bananas

Week 3 (March 24-28) - Carrots Week 4 (March 31-Apr. 4) - Cucumber

Week 5 (Apr. 7-11) - Apples Week 6 (Apr. 14-18) - Celery

Week 7 (Apr. 21-25) - Grapes or bananas Week 8 (Apr. 28—May 2) - Carrots
