School Skating Program

This program will begin next week for some classes. Students involved in the program will need a pair of skates and a helmet. **Helmets must have a safety strap and fit appropriately. Bike helmets, ski helmets, and hockey helmets will work for this program.**

In the event that school is closed or busses are delayed by 2 hours on a skating day then that skating day will have to be rescheduled to a later date. It will never be the next school day.

In the event that school is open and busses are delayed by only 1 hour on a skating day then the skating day will be still a go, since all our skating start times are 10 am.

For the lower grades (K-2) parent help is always appreciated at the rink for tying skates, so if you are able to help out on skating days then please let your child's teacher know so help can be distributed between the sessions. Sometimes we have too much help for the 1st session and not enough for the 2nd session.

In the **year before starting school**, parents/caregivers and their children are invited to attend one or more Welcome to Kindergarten Family orientations at their neighborhood school and/or community partner agency.

Families participate in activities using books, magnetic numbers and letters, arts and craft, music and movement and games. Families meet school principals, kindergarten teachers, school resource personnel, and staff from community support agencies.

Educators provide training on why and how family planned activities using the resources in the *Welcome to Kindergarten™* bag will help their children be better prepared for school and learning.

Every family receives the Welcome to Kindergarten bag full with books, activities, resources and the parent information page Have fun and help your child get ready for school.

Dressing for Winter Weather

It is important to keep your head warm in cold weather because most of the heat you lose is through the top of your head.

Waiting for the School Bus


- Allow extra time to get to your bus stop.
- Wear bright clothing so the bus can see you in the early morning.
- Stand away from where the bus stops. Buses need extra room to stop.

Snowbanks may hide you when trying to cross the street, look out around the snowbank and make sure the driver sees you.
