CREDIT SYSTEM

All grade 11 and 12 all courses are given a value of 1 credit each.

We have two semesters each year, and 5 courses offered each semester.

Between grades 11 and 12 there is the opportunity to get 20 regular credits.

In grade 10, you have your first opportunity for a credit towards graduation from your second semester math class (NRF 10 or Financial And Workplace Math 110).

You also get an additional credit from G3 at the end of grade 12.

CREDIT SYSTEM

Grade Ten - 1 credit

Grade Eleven - 10 credits

Grade Twelve - 10 credits

Growth Goals Grit (G3) - 1 credit

COURSE LEVELS

The first two numbers indicate the grade and the last number indicates the level. Many students will take grade 11 courses in grade 12 and vice versa.

Open or “O” courses are offered at one level only.

Ex: Physical Geography 110, Ind. Family Dynamics 120

Level 1 are enriched university preparatory.

Ex: English 111, Physics 121

Level 2 are academic/university/college preparatory.

Ex: Music 112, Biology 122

Level 3 are general/college preparatory.

Ex: Modern History 113, English 123
