

Graduation Requirements

You need a minimum of 18 Credits to Graduate. This must include:

The following compulsory credits:

- English 11 and 12 (3 credits)
- Math (2 credit of NRF10, Financial & Workplace, Foundations, NBCC Trades, Pre-Calc, Precalc A, Precalc B and Calculus)
- Science (1 credit)
- History 11 (1 credit)
- Fine Arts/Life Role Development cluster (1 credit)

You must also have:

- 5 credits at the Grade 12 Level.
- Successful completion of the English Language Proficiency Assessment
- Post Intensive French (PIF) 10 or French Immersion Language Arts (FILA) 10

- Assessments: Interests, Skills, Learning Styles
- Career Information: (tasks, salary, required education, etc...)
- Education Information: (College / University information, Program information)

College

- 1- or 2-year programs, hands-on approach, bridging opportunities, ex: NBCC, Oulton, NSCAD
- Admission requirements vary. **Check each program!**
- Applications at NBCC are open,
- Open House is October 24 and we are going!
- NBCC visiting October 21st at lunch

University

- Typically, 4-year programs,
- Check each program/school for admission requirements,
- Average of 70+% in the courses used for admission.
- STU visiting October 7, UNB October 8
- Open House: Oct. 5 (Saint John), Oct. 19 (Fredericton)

Applying to College / University

- Select the program (MyBluePrint can help),
- Select the post-secondary institutions,
- Check admission requirements,
- Arrange a campus visit (if possible),
- Apply online and pay fee,
- Arrange to have transcripts sent (at least two: February & June)

Scholarships/Bursaries

- A few large national scholarships have fall deadlines (ex: Loran, Schulich),
- Info is on our Post-Secondary board and in the Grade 12 team,



Scholarships/Bursaries

- Scholarship info:
- <u>ASD-S | Welcome to Sussex Regional High School</u> (nbed.nb.ca)
- Every student should apply for the General Scholarship
- Start at the top of the list and work down selecting scholarships for which you qualify

Advice for Scholarship/Award Applications

- Create a master list of all the awards you are interested in applying for— with deadlines,
- Read the details—criteria, terms and conditions,
- Apply for the awards best suited to your personal profile and interests,
- Re-visit the sites regularly to see what's new

Student Loans

- Studentaid.gnb.ca
- Starts in the spring, once accepted into program,
- Application is completed online,
- You will need to have family financial information, may need to complete with a parent/guardian
