Driver Responsibilities

- Drivers are to be familiar with Policy 701 and as per School District guidelines for
- Volunteers in the School (D6-AG#6-362), and if they will be alone with students,
 there must be a Criminal Records Check on file.
- Drivers to be at least 21 years of age, in good health, and hold a valid driver's license of the appropriate class for the vehicle being driven.
- Mandatory \$2,000,000 liability insurance coverage.
- Vehicle's insurer to be notified that students are being transported from time to time.
- I have winter tires on my vehicle from October 15 to April 30 each year.
- Drivers to exercise mature driving judgment, especially during poor weather and visibility conditions.
- Vehicle's valid safety inspection sticker to be properly displayed.
- Vehicle's seat belts to be used.
- Luggage to be securely stored, not to obstruct vision or block aisles and exit doors.
- Driver is to have with them emergency phone numbers (especially if the trip is after regular school hours) including the number where the principal or designate can be reached.
- A cell phone or other communication device is recommended.
- Drivers not to drive when tired or unable to function at normal level of efficiency.
