## **COVID Cases @RHS**


We are now 7 days into a full return to classes and as expected we have had a few cases reported each day of the past week. Schools and Public Health do not undertake contact tracing for these cases.

The new protocols place the burden of notification on the person who tests positive. Both positive cases and close contacts as asked to isolate.

A close contact is someone who you have been in proximity (under 2m/6ft), without masks for longer than 15 minutes. Students should be contacting the peers with whom they eat lunch in the event they test positive.

Please continue to advise the school when you or someone in your household tests positive or if you must isolate.

## Supporting Your Students @Home

Absences & Missed Time - some advice

- Phone a Friend: It will be important that your student has someone in each class that they can reach out to if they miss class. This person can share their notes from the day, let your student know about any tests/quizzes coming up and otherwise keep them up to date
- Consult TEAMS: While we are no longer providing an online learning model teachers continue to use TEAMS for course outlines, handouts, assignments etc. Students should explore TEAMS before sending questions to the teacher.
- 3. Seek help from the teacher: Either upon their return to school or via TEAMS students can seek assistance from their teachers. The reply via TEAMS may take up to 24-48 hours depending on circumstances.

#### WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Post-Intensive French and French Immersion students currently in Grades 9 and 10



#### WHAT WILL IT LOOK LIKE?

- This will be a four-week summer French program at l'Université de Moncton
