


Risk-Taking & Innovation

Silver Linings from a COVID year.

For the longest time the newsletter had to take a very specific focus on the immediate – phase colour changes, rule adjustments within the school, reassessment planning etc... This week, during the calm before the storm that is June, I would like to share some of the progress made within the walls of RHS this year.

- 1. *RHS became an AP Capstone School!* In September of 2021 we will be teaching our first cohort of AP Capstone students with our first anticipated graduates crossing the stage in 2023. Offering this program will place us on par with schools like SJHS, STM, HVHS and RNS and will allow graduates to better compete in the Canadian University market.
- 2. RHS Library is getting a make-over! We began a slow transition this year to make our library into a true Learning Commons by updating furniture, opening more space for collaborative work and by staffing it next year with our third Educational Support Teacher. This space will allow student services to better support classroom teachers in teaching accommodated and adjusted students.
- 3. RHS Courtyard as an Outdoor Classroom & Performance Space! Our courtyard received both an infusion of energy and resources when a group of staff, under Shane Kelbaugh's guidance, removed the overgrown garden beds and prepared for this week's arrival of sod. When complete this courtyard will serve not only as an outdoor gathering and teaching space but a performing arts venue as well!
- 4. School Improvement Planning! Our staff have all adapted, innovated, and adjusted their way through this year and have gained skills in teaching with technology, assessment practices and social emotional learning. As we head into June, we will be committing to some areas of focus moving forward using the best of what we learned this year merged with areas of interest from pre-COVID times.
