

Preparing for Re-Assessment – the largest gains in both knowledge & skills were made by students who prepared/studied for re-assessment.

- Parent Portal please check all grades and assignments by clicking on the S2 grade for each course and seeing:
 - What is missing? Get the missing assignments handed-in!
 - What is lower than expected? Target these areas
- Studying/Preparing students should be asking for guidance on how to best prepare for re-assessment from their subject teachers. This can be done before school, at lunch, after school or via TEAMS chat/private channels.
- Reduce Screen Time and Encourage Rest students perform best when they sleep well so helping your teen with reducing screen time before bed should pay off during re-assessment. Encourage your students to turn the phone off at least 30min-1hr before bed

Please be advised that Photography Flewwelling will be offering summer grad photo sessions for the graduating class of 2022 during the weeks of July 12th-16th & 19th-23rd and the weeks of August 9th-13th & 16th-20th. These sessions will take place at our studio located at 85 Princess Street, Saint John.

We will be contacting the grads of 2022 (who signed up at the school in May/June) to schedule appointments. You can contact the studio directly to schedule an appointment for those who did not sign up at the school already.

We offer these early summer sessions so the students can have outdoor photography and friendship photos taken. Graduate photography will also take place at the school in the fall and notices will be sent home in the fall (from the school) with more information on those dates.

The sitting fees for these summer sessions are:

Indoor grad (cap and gown) - 6 poses \$25.00
9 poses \$30.00

Outdoor casual session - 6 poses \$25.00
9 poses \$30.00

Friendship session (two people) - 6 poses \$25.00
(\$5.00 for each additional person)

The above fees are taxes included and are for the above designated summer days only. Private session (on any other day) fees are higher. Fees at the school in the fall are the same as our summer dates however, we do not offer outdoor casual or friendship sittings then.
