Assessment - F.A.Q.'s


During the 2020-2021 school year we decided at RHS to use re-assessment tasks instead of traditional exams to promote mastery learning and allow for students to demonstrate their learning right up until the end of the course. This was to aid to filling gaps left in students' knowledge from the COVID-19 school closures.

In 2021-2022 we will be having exams in some courses at the grade 11 & 12 levels where it is the best way to assess knowledge. In other courses at the grade 11 & 12 levels we will use projects, presentations, and interviews as final assessments where appropriate. At the grades 9 & 10 level we will continue to use re-assessment for all courses to continue to promote mastery of the course content so that students have fewer gaps heading into credit courses.

For families new to RHS here is a video that I shared with the school last year to explain why we choose re-assessment over comprehensive exams in our Grade 9 & 10 courses and why we are using re-assessment as part of our assessment practice in all courses. <u>Mastery Learning Video</u>

Rothesay High School teachers are invested in learning about best practices in assessment and work very hard each day to make sure your students know where they are in their learning through feedback and to make sure than any grade, they assign accurately reflects your student's knowledge. As outlined last week teachers communicate directly with students but do share some important details with families via Parent Portal.

If you note an INC in the gradebook, it means that your student has not provided evidence of learning (missed a test, missed a deadline, or did not submit coursework) and this requires immediate remedy. Students can make appointments for lunch time help, can ask questions via TEAMS, or can simply work with a parent/sibling or tutor to catch up. Please check PowerSchool with your student sometime this week. Quarter 1 grades will be finalised on Monday Nov 8 and Report Cards will be issued on Friday November 12.

Supporting Your Students @Home

Being a Good Neighbour – a community message with a school focus. I am asking families to have a discussion this week with their students about their behaviour both during school hours and beyond in the Rothesay area. We, the RedHawk Community, owe our community better treatment and cannot expect to find partnerships with local businesses unless we treat the immediate area better. We have had several calls from the community recently about.

- Littering: Student drivers and those who visit the Irving Circle K or K.C.'s pizza are the biggest culprits. We will be purchasing extra garbage bins for the exterior of the school, but students must be reminded that it is never acceptable to just drop garbage on the ground.
- **Trespassing:** KRPF have received several calls from neighbours of our property of students gathering in wooded areas and backyards to vape and are leaving a wake of garbage and damage behind them. Please take time this week to explain the consequences of these actions and to remind students of the need for respect of others property
- Intimidation: Some students have also been crossing private property to gather on beaches and other wooded areas intimidating the residents who own the property. KRPF officers have responded to these calls and will continue to intervene when neighbours complain.

• Wear a white shirt and a tie (a tie in your school colours looks best). The studio has a white shirt and ties for you to borrow, if necessary.


If you are wearing a dress on graduation day:

- If you normally wear make-up, consider using a little more than usual, but do not overdo it. If you never wear make-up, you might consider wearing it on photo day. A cosmetics specialist at a drug store would be happy to teach you the basics.

- Some students like to have one shot taken with a prop such as a musical instrument or some other cherished item.
- Do not make a drastic change to your appearance in the days leading up to your appointment. Even a fresh haircut might not look the way you intend, so you might think about getting a haircut one to two weeks before your appointment.
