READING	
readtheory.org	Sign up for an account. It adjusts the reading level of the material as students read and tracks their progress.
teachyourmonstertoread.com	Create a free account. It's like an interactive video game where the student learns vocabulary and letter sounds.
getepic.com	Create a free account. Best for K-6. Has digital books that students can read.
uniteforliteracy.com	Students can read books in English and listen to them in their mother tongue. Best for elementary aged students.
gradesaver.com	Novels, short story support – theme, character information, summaries, etc.
litcharts.com	Novels, short story support – theme, character information, summaries, etc.
esl-bits.net	Novels, short stories support – themes, character information, summaries, etc. Reads the material aloud at adjustable speeds. (press ctrl F to search for a key word in a text)
proofreadingservies.com	Essay topics to help students improve their writing
audiobooksync.com	Best for ages 13+. Free downloadable audio books. Can be set up as a summer reading program.
childrenslibrary.org	All ages. Has books in multiple languages to support maintaining first language.
commonlit.org	Best suited for high school or middle. Search articles by lexile level, topic, etc. The site will read the text to the student. It will also translate words if needed. If you set up 'guided reading' mode, it will force the students to stop reading and answer questions.

youtube.com	For young learners. These have songs and videos to help with letters, sounds and word formation. Suggested channels: ELF Learning, Busy Beavers, Electric Company, Magic E
llcsj.weebly.com	For younger beginning learners: A one-stop shopping website with everything you need for EAL (website links, videos, lessons, worksheets, games.)
http://learnthealphabet.org/	Engaging videos that help teach the alphabet (one video per letter.)

k12reader.com	Excellent resource for free worksheets (spelling, reading comprehension, grammar practice, writing support, etc.)
comprehension-worksheets.com	Phonics / sight word themed comprehension worksheets (letter, blend, double letter, sight word level.)
englishforeveryone.org	Comprehensive collection of LA worksheets, organized by need (comp, grammar, writing, spelling, etc.)
englishmaven.org	Interactive collection of LA worksheets, organized by need (comp, grammar, writing, spelling, etc.)
ereadingworksheets.com	Collection of LA worksheets, organized by need, which could be used to reinforce a new skill set (extra independent practice for more advanced students.)
learningchocolate.com	Students can click on a vocabulary picture and hear the word, in addition to many games.
flashcard.online	Themed, printable flashcards (K-12.) Click on Ready Flashcards, at the top of the page, for 8 pages of premade flashcards.
turtlediary.com	One stop shop for LA games, lessons, worksheets, quizzes and videos.
lakeshorelearning.com	K-5. Has reading and writing practice, fun lessons plans, games and activities for many subject areas.
textcompactor.com	Text can be cut and pasted into a box, then it shrinks the word count (adjustable).
rewordify.com	Text can be cut and pasted into a box, then it is reworded to be simpler.
