#### Welcome to the 2021-2022 School Year!

Welcome H.E.S. families to the start of another wonderful school year! We are thrilled to be welcoming back our returning students (oh my, how they have grown!) as well as three classes of Grade 2 French Immersion students and two classes of Grade 3 English students. Our staff look forward to partnering with you as we provide the best learning opportunities for your child. Please be in regular contact with your child's teacher and try to become involved ; both the Home & School or our Parent Support School Committee are great options which will be held virtually beginning in October!

We will be sending home one message per week to families; the "HES Hawk Squawk" will be sent electronically every Friday around 5pm. We will only send extra messages if there is information you absolutely need to receive before the end of the week. Newsletters will be sent at the beginning of each month. Please ensure your email address is up-to-date in our system as this is the primary mode of communication for school wide messages. The first newsletter is the only one sent in hard copy!

A few things to help make our school year go more smoothly—first, please follow our drop off procedures if your child is being driven to school. A teacher will begin morning supervision at 7:50 so students being driven should not arrive before this time. Students will play outside with their grade level peers until the 8:15 bell when all students will line up in their classes and enter the school to prepare for the day. Please be aware of the speed limit of 20 km/hr on School Street.

We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- Keep a positive attitude and a growth mindset around school and learning.
- 2. Attends school daily and arrives on time (by 8:20) ready for the day's learning experience
- 3. Completes homework assignments (10 minutes per Grade level)
- 4. Reads daily (or is read to daily) to develop a love for reading and to improve literacy skills Finally, the student handbook is included in the student agenda which will be distributed soon. We ask you to review the information included in these pages with your child. We even have a student handbook scavenger hunt contest!



#### Policy 711—Healthy Eating

The Department of Education has an ongoing commitment to promoting healthier eating and nutrition. This is reflected in the release of Policy 711- Healthier Foods and Nutrition in Public Schools.



Policy 711, Healthier School Food Environment, sets the minimum requirements for creating a healthier food environment in public schools.

This policy applies to all school districts and public schools in New Brunswick including: classroom, co-curricular, extra-curricular, fundraising, school sponsored and endorsed activities and events.

#### Connect with nature

Day-to-day life is usually a blur of passing lights, blaring sounds, and people's voices. Connecting with nature helps you find peace in your busy life while making the world a better place. The town of Hampton boasts many beautiful trails. You could take an evening stroll, bike ride, or even a guided nature walk. Research shows that spending time in nature can make us happier, more relaxed,

and even healthier.
Spend some time each day outside observing what's happening around you. You'll begin to notice things about your environment that you've never seen before, and increase your awareness of your surroundings.



#### **Medication/Health Services and Custody Information**

It is very important that the school is kept informed of any <u>medical or custody concerns</u> with respect to your child. Please be specific when completing the Information form that was sent home earlier this week. Please provide your child's teacher with any information on the Student Information form. The Dept. of Education requires <u>formal medical information forms</u> for children with a severe medical condition (e.g. severe allergies, diabetes, severe asthma etc., or parents with children who require medication at school). This Health Support and Care form is available at the school office (Policy 704). The *No Child Without* program offers a free MedicAlert membership to students who attend our school and are between the ages of 4 up to their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday. If your child has a medical condition, allergy or is required to take medication on a regular basis then you should consider a MedicAlert membership through this program. MedicAlert is your child's voice in an emergency. If your child is already part of the *No Child* 

Without program and there have been changes to their medical condition, medications or emergency contact information, call MedicAlert at 1-866-679-3220 to update your child's file.



<u>Custody information</u> that restricts access to your child can only be put into place if the school has a copy of a court order stating the restricted access.


# Education Support Services at HES

Hello Hawk Families!

We have three resource teachers at HES- Julie Stewart, Kate Johnson (part time resource, part time guidance), and Heather Avery (working with Grade 5 Smith and Grade 4 Shannon). Some of you may be wondering what the role of the Resource teacher is. Here's a quick overview:

- -60% of our day is spent on supporting and collaborating with classroom teachers. For example, classroom observation, co-planning of instruction, initiating and supporting instructional strategies, problem solving, modeling, co-teaching, etc.
- -25% of our day involves direct instruction or intervention with small groups of children, and occasionally, with individual students, but in all cases with specific entry and exit criteria, and documentation of outcomes achieved. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, we will only be working with small groups of students from the same class.
- 15% of our day encompasses administrative duties directly associated with supporting teachers and students. For example, work on personalized learning plans, working with educational assistants, consulting with other professionals, etc.

#### Class Organization 2021-2022

Here is the final class organization approved for the school year. Overall we will have 15 homerooms this year.

2- Grade 3 Class 3- Grade 2 French Immersion

2- Grade 4 Class 2- Grade 3 French Immersion

2- Grade 4 French Immersion

3- Grade 5 Classes 1- Grade 5 French Immersion

Students have been assigned to classes through a team approach. As a staff, we reflect on a variety of factors, such as achievement, work habits, behavior, ratio of boys to girls, friendships, learning styles and teaching styles. Our goal is to maintain a balance in each classroom in order to facilitate each student's ability to achieve to his or her potential.

#### **Changes in After School Routine**

Due to restrictions on bus seating, we are unable to accommodate changes to after school bus routines. Many buses are full and it takes time to arrange alternate transportation. Anglophone South School District has a bus policy that states that: "Without authorization in writing, from the parent (24 hours in advance), children will be sent home on their regular bus. No same day verbal arrangements will be allowed unless it is an emergency situation." Children are not permitted to travel on a different bus after school for play dates, birthday parties, sleepovers, etc. Parents need to make other arrangements for these situations. If you are picking up your child in lieu of them taking the bus, please send a written note to the classroom teacher.

All changes to bussing must be completed through the Transportation Department by calling 832-6143.

#### Guidance Corner

Square Saturday, September 25 from 12:00-5:30 (rain date: Sunday, Sept. 26). The gathering will begin with two powwow drums leading a grand entry of Elders, dancers, student representatives, and community leaders into the Town Square. To open the powwow, Elders will share their insights regarding the children of residential schools. Dancers representing various First Nation dances (traditional, grass-dancers, fancy shawl, jingle dress, and tiny tots) will engage the public in a colourful cultural experience.

#### **School Discipline Expectations**

The staff of Hampton Elementary School has been diligently and gently teaching children a variety of expected behaviors and routines. We firmly believe that students who do not master these behaviors and routines may need extra practice in order to meet the expectations of school discipline. These behaviors and routines are expected to be mastered by all students before the end of September. The staff asks for your support if and when your child may need to have extra practice in any of the school discipline expectations. The following are just a few of the routines and behaviors that teachers will be reinforcing for the month of September; saying please and thank you; movement in hallways; morning announcement routine; fire drill exit; how to speak to an adult, and many more.

#### <u>Grade 5 student leadership</u>

All grade 5 students are invited to express interest for leadership opportunities this school year. Each week Leadership

jobs will be assigned to a Grade 5 homeroom class so students can work together for a week at a time within their homeroom class. We will have grade 5's who will be part of the Recycling Team, Playground Safety Leaders, Volunteers and the list goes on!

#### **Instructional Time**

All public schools in the province follow curricula prescribed by the New Brunswick Department of Education. Curricula expectations are extensive and at H.E.S we must attempt to protect valuable instructional time.



Please note that in order for students to be ready to learn, they must be in the building no later than 8:20 AM. Interruptions to the instructional day are to be limited to emergencies.

- If you need to communicate to your child's teacher through the day, please send a note in the child's agenda with the information or request a phone call after instructional hours.
- If you are delivering something to your child through the day, please leave the item at the office and we will see that it is delivered to the classroom at noon or recess
- If you are meeting your child after school and this is not their regular after school routine, please wait until after the bus dismissal and then pick up your child at the front doors.

#### School Supply and Student Fees

Our school fees for all students grades two to five are \$52.00. This includes all consumable supplies and school performances/events for the school year. If you have financial difficulty covering any of those school fees, please bring your concern to the attention of the school administrative team. The school fee is a one-time fee but can be paid in multiple installments if that is easier for you and your family.

#### **Calling and Visiting the School**

The phone number for the school office is 832-6021. The best time to contact teachers is after 2:45 p.m. as it is almost impossible for teachers to leave their classrooms unattended during the school day. Please also be observant of the fact that schools are very busy places. If you wish to see a teacher or administrator at the school, please call and make an appointment, and we will gladly find the time to meet with you. We are unable to accommodate drop-ins this year due to COVID restrictions in place. If you must take your child out from the school during instructional hours please buzz into the office and your child will be brought outside to you.

#### **Music Room in September:**

Welcome back HES families, I hope you all enjoyed the wonderful summer we had.

Grade 2-3's- The human body is the first musical instrument and the students



this month will be exploring different ways to make music, such as clapping, stomping, patting knees and snapping fingers. In doing so the students will also be learning the difference between what the beat, and the rhythm are in a piece of music. Percussion instruments will also be used for these purposes during the month of September.

Students will also be using poems and simple songs to practice using their singing voices- tone that is pleasant, light and never forced or shouty. In doing so they will be reinforcing their knowledge about beats and rhythm's as well as their knowledge on the dynamics, tempo, and pitch of a piece of music.

Grade 4-5's- Students will be reviewing and building on prior knowledge they have of the different musical elements such as dynamics, tempo, pitch, rhythm and form. This will be done through games, songs, and class activities. They will then be demonstrating their knowledge of these elements by creating their own pieces of music and presenting them to their classmates.

Students will be focusing on Strand 1 of the Music curriculum outcomes this month which focuses on creating, making, and presenting. GCO 1-Students will explore, challenge, develop, and express ideas, using the skills, language, techniques, and processes of the arts. GCO 2-Students will be expected to create and/ or present, collaboratively, and independently, expressive products in the arts for a range of audiences and purposes.
