School Supplies Fee

Our School Supplies Fee this year is \$60.00 per child payable the first month of school.

If you are unable to pay all of this fee by September 30, please contact the office and we would be happy to set up a payment plan for you.

This fee covers supplies such as notebooks, duotangs, glue, pencils, erasers, crayons, pen-

cil cases, rulers, scissors, loose leaf, etc. which the school has purchased and provided to each student. You can pay by cheque, cash or online. Please visit our school website for information on online payments.

Contacting the School

We strive to maintain a close and cooperative relationship with our families. We are happy to talk to you about questions or concerns that you may have.

The best time to contact a teacher is after 2:15p.m as it is very difficult for teachers to try to give matters their full attention during instruction time.

Please do not email your child's teacher with anything that requires immediate attention as email is often not checked during instructional hours.



Safe Arrival & Attendance

In ASD-S, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

The Safe Arrival system reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance, makes it easier for you to report your child's absence and makes it easier for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With Safe Arrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:


Using your mobile device, download and install the **SchoolMessenger app** from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.


Use the Safe Arrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.

Call the toll-free number 1-833-219-9065 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

In addition, we will use the **School Messenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up. If you report your child's absence in advance using the **Safe Arrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.







Medication & Health Services at School

Please provide your child's teacher with any important medical information about your child on the Student Information Form. Parents of a child who has a severe medical condition (for example, severe allergy that requires an Epipen; diabetes; severe asthma) must contact us and fill out an Essential Routine Services and Emergency Plan form and/or an Extreme Allergy Management and Emergency Plan form. Your child's safety is our first priority.


