6. Outstanding Action Items -

Grade 9 Wellness Fair was held on November 1st and was attended by Carmen Atkinson and Carolyn McCoy. Notes below provided from Carolyn-

The Grade 9 Wellness Fair was held on the morning of November 1. The following groups were represented and each presented information on a health or wellness topic to the students: District Healthy Learner Nurse (a variety of wellness topics), Drivewise Atlantic Driving Academy (road safety), KVHS Health Nurse (sexual health, health services available at KVHS), KV Oasis (services available at KV Oasis), KVHS Work Room (services available at KV Oasis), Portage (addiction awareness and information on the services offered through Portage), Kennebecasis Regional Police Force (road safety, substance use), Saint John Regional Hospital Trauma unit (concussion awareness and prevention), Sweet Caroline Foundation (allergy and anaphylaxis awareness, autoinjector use), Town of Quispamsis Recreation Services (services available in Quispamsis), and TRC Youth Resource Centre (services offered at TRC). Students were each given a questionnaire to complete by visiting the booths, which helped encourage them to engage with the presenters. Every participating presenter was sent a thank you card from the PSSC.

7. New Action Items-

- a. Policy 711 (nutrition policy) JoEllen Jensen provided overview of policy
 - Committee reviewed the Appendix C How are We Doing? Assessment
 - Discussed opportunities to improve school's food environment
 - Opportunities to make food available for children in need
 - Opportunities for partnerships to promote healthy living (apple orchards, local markets, etc)
 - Carmen, in her role as Public Health nurse, provided background on policy development
 - Students were communicated to in advisory and discussed how to make advisory breakfasts fall within the policy
 - Many on the committee feel that that the updated policy focuses more on enforcement rather than healthy choice, balance, wellness
 - School is lacking in budget to promote the policy
 - It was expressed that Policy 711 should be part of a school improvement plan; not realistic to be implemented within a 6-12 month period. The culture change will take time
 - Curriculum could be modified as part of next school improvement plan to include outcomes related to Policy 711
 - Policy does not differentiate between closed school event and public event
 - PSSC's recommendation is to implement into SIP; concern over it being a
 prohibition rather than balance, and minimal focus at high school level on
 exercise and active living
