<u>CLUBS</u>

Grand Bay Primary is thrilled to announce the start-up of CLUBS on Nov. 14th.

Clubs run every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday for 4 weeks, from 12:15-12:35pm. Clubs will be facilitated by teachers and EAs. Students may only select 1 club per round, and they must commit to that club for the entire 4-weeks.

Due to limited enrollment in each club, students may have to wait until round 2 for the club they would like to try. After the 4 weeks, we will begin a new round of clubs with new students. Clubs are optional and not required. Clubs we are currently offering in Round 1 are:

- Building Club for Grade 1's (Lego, Kinex etc.)
- Coding Club for Grade 2's (Learning to code, Go robots)
- Puzzle Club for Kindergarten (large floor puzzles)
- Arts and Crafts clubs (grade level TBD)
