## **Key Concepts**

1. Drop a word's final silent *e* to add a suffix starting with a vowel.
debate + able = debatable
urge + ent = urgent
file + ing = filing

**2.** Drop the *e* to add -*y*. nose + y = nosy

**3.** To add *-ly* to a word ending in *le*, usually drop the *le*. *able* + *ly* = *ably* 

**4.** Exceptions to memorize: *mile* + *age* = *mileage whole* + *ly* = *wholly*
