1. To add a suffix starting with a consonant, keep a word's final silent e.

spite + ful = spiteful

place + ment = placement

2. Memorize two exceptions: judge + ment = judgment awe + ful = awful

3. In words with the soft *c* or *g* sound, keep the *e* when adding a suffix starting with *a* or *o*. trace + able = traceable outrage + ous = outrageous

4. When adding suffixes to words ending in *ee* or *oe*, the final *e* is usually kept. free + dom = freedom free + ing = freeing

hoe + ing = hoeing
