## **Key Concepts**

1. Nouns with -ion end in one of two ways: -tion or -sion.

relation correction tension confusion (Only one English noun ends in -cion: suspicion.)

- 2. Since -tion and -sion sound the same, you need to memorize the spellings of -ion nouns. Try to visualize these words as you learn them.
- 3. Many word roots change form when -ion is added.

decide + ion = decision

intrude + ion = intrusion

receive + ion = reception

permit + ion = permission

4. Some -ion nouns have no familiar word root.
