Word Bank

adjoined misdeed evacuate misspelling disappearance adept extensive intolerance insolvable emigrate

Key Concepts

1. Prefixes change the meanings of word roots.

ad- = toward dis- = not ex- (e-) = out, forth in- = into, not mis- = wrong, bad

2. Keep all the letters of a word root when you add a prefix.

ad + just = adjust dis+ agree = disagree dis + satisfy = dissatisfy mis + step = misstep mis + trust = mistrust
