#### **Woodstock Middle School**

For the past three years, Woodstock Middle School has applied for, and received a grant to have a published author visit our school. This is mainly funded by the Department of Education, with a very small sum required from the school. After receiving word of our acceptance into the program, we looked through the biographies of NB authors. This year, we chose Lynn Davies, a Fredericton poet, to visit our school. We chose 30 students to be involved in this enrichment opportunity, 10 from each grade level. Students were chosen based on their ability as a writer and also their enthusiasm towards writing. Lynn put on an incredible, hands-on workshop. Students were actively involved throughout their session and came away with lots of writing ideas they can use in their academic writing.
