Here is the latest Math update for 8D, 8E, 8G & 8H:

EVALUATIONS:

On Tuesday October 22nd (Wednesday 23rd for 8D), your child should have brought home his/her "Math Evaluations" folder in their communication folder. Unless he/she was absent somewhere along the way, your child had three new evaluations added to the folder (total of 5: 3 on left side, 2 on right side):

- LEFT SIDE (REVIEW)
 - Mini-quiz on Prime and composite numbers
- RIGHT SIDE (grade 8 material)
 - Mini-quiz 1 (up to #6 in section N of the binder)
 - Mini-Quiz 2 (up to #11 in section N of the binder)

*** They have known for quite some time but, in case they forgot to tell you, all four classes will write their **SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT (Unit test) on Square Number and Square Roots (everything in Section N of the binder) on Monday October 28**th. Each class will have had three review periods by that time. In the "Révision" section of their binder, there are three pages of questions that they can practice with detailed answers in the sample binder in class for them to check their work at any time.

MANGAHIGH.COM:


