Milk is set up as an online payment so it is the preferred way to pay your milk order.



2019 Terry Fox Run Update

Gwen Smith-Walsh, Director of the N.B./P.E.I. Terry Fox Foundation has good news for the Montgomery Street School community. If you remember back to September, 2019, the Clark Family Foundation challenged a group of 22 Fredericton area schools, ours included, to collectively raise \$17 500. The 22

schools actually collected closer to \$22 000 so the Clark Family foundation added \$17 500 to our total. Mrs. Walsh particularly wants to congratulate Montgomery Street School. We alone raised \$3076. This is \$900 more than what we collected in 2018 and the most raised by any of the schools participating in the challenge.
