EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANT ONLINE COURSES

NBCC Educational Assistant courses are available through part-time study online. Take one or more courses for interest or take all the courses part-time towards achieving a certificate in as little as two years.

The certificate is accepted to apply for employment in the public school system in New Brunswick and in PEI.

Online courses offer a flexible learning option for working adults, enabling them to continue employment without the commitment of full-time study. Courses have specific start and end dates and due dates for assignments, but you decide when to study.

* Please note that continuing education students register for individual courses and are not enrolled in a program. Program requirements may change without notice. Regardless of courses completed, students must meet EA program admission requirements, including high school graduation or GED, to graduate from the EA certificate program. (Individuals for whom English is not a first language may need to meet NBCC language requirements.)
