Hatchery and Farm Managers

The summer student, based in Burt's Corner, New Brunswick will have an opportunity to gain poultry industry experience working at one of AP's commercial chick hatcheries and a breeder farm that supplies fertilized hatching eggs. This student will train to back fill employees on vacation, and do special projects as time allows.

This position includes manual labour such as egg collection and packing, bird moves and vaccinations, cleaning and disinfection of the hatchery and barns, setting and transfer of hatching eggs, grounds maintenance and other general tasks. The position may also include some office work, including hatchery and farm data collection, input and analysis.

The work schedule for this position is generally a 40 hour work week, from May through late August. However, flexibility to work some evenings, weekends or holidays is required.

Job Duties

- Hatchery: setting eggs in incubators, transferring eggs from setters to hatchers, cleaning, loading trucks,
- Weighing and recording egg or bird weights

- Handling of live birds for vaccinations or moves
- Grounds maintenance
- Washing and cleaning of barns and equipment
- Set up and break down of equipment before and after cleaning of barns
- Data input and analysis
- Other duties as required
