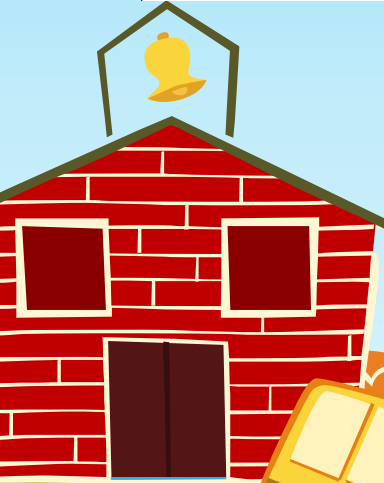

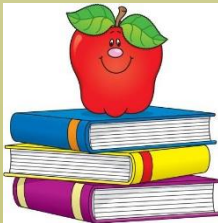


Change of clothes

Leveled books

Show what you know

Look for a blue folder to come home this week with a '*show what you know*' math worksheet. This work was completed independently in class and will give you a good idea of what skills your child has mastered and will still need to work on. 😊

This week in class:

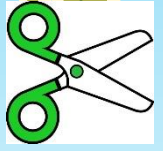
Literacy: We will be taking a short break from our 2nd theme : “Social interaction” – being a good friend. We will work on some Halloween themed activities/vocabulary.

Math: numbers to 100. We will be concentrating on addition and subtraction to 18 in the upcoming weeks. Focusing our attentions on the following strategies (make 10 (friendly numbers), one/two more - one/two less, doubles).

This week at home:

- **Math:** Addition facts; our focus will be on adding doubles, one more/one less, two more/two less, make 10. You can practice at home using these strategies and adding numbers up to 18 (and beyond for a challenge).
 - **Reading :** *Please read in English or French for 15minutes every night.*
- ** Practicing the weekly sight words counts towards the 15minutes of reading/day.

Please note that the homework tasks are meant to be overwhelming, if you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to let me know.
