Credit (CRD) vs Enrolled (ENR) vs “Pre-COVID” Class

How to obtain	You would attend class 5 days a week. You would complete any assignments, homework, quizzes, tests, and final assessments and/or conferences.	*Check the list on the school website to confirm your class is offering a Credit option. You would need to complete and submit the work your teacher provides for a credit. If you have not seen this information yet reach out to your teacher via email to obtain it.	Nothing is required to obtain Enrolled. If you choose not to complete and submit the work, or if you are unable to complete and submit the work your teacher provides you will be given the Enrolled status for your class.
What will it look like on my Transcript?	It would show your numeric grade (0-100). You would be given 1 credit on your transcript if your grade was 60% or higher.	It will show CR You will be given 1 credit on your transcript.	It will show ENR You will be given 0 credits on your transcript. ¹
What is required to graduate?	A minimum of 12 credits, from grades 11 and 12, at the end of semester one with a numerical grade (60-100%).	five more courses at either/any of ENROLLED or CREDIT (from this semester).	

¹ Students who receive ENR (enrolled) can move on without penalty. For **example**, if you are in grade 11 and your science or fine arts/ life role (or any grad requirement) is this semester, you do not need to repeat it for graduation purposes.

*Students at the end of semester one with less than 12 achieved credits would not be in a position to graduate. Please contact your Guidance Counselor if you have any questions.

For all grade 11/12 students:

We recommend pursuing no more than three courses for credit, but if you are in a position to do more, then you may. Our primary concern is our students’ mental health and wellbeing. Look after yourselves first and continue your learning as you are able.

In choosing what courses to focus on, please focus on courses that are pre-requisites to your next years’ courses. If you are in grade 12, you are focusing on courses needed for your university programs.

We do not have all the answers from universities at this time, but, we are hopeful that students will not be disadvantaged when starting university due to the Covid-19 pandemic. *Grade 12 students are, again, focusing on courses that will enhance their learning and lead to more success in first year post-secondary.*

Grade 11 are focusing on pre-requisite courses for grade 12 courses—your having one or two or more courses as ENR will not disadvantage your academic record or suggest lack of work ethic—we know these are unprecedented times and not all students, from home, have equal opportunity at this time.

If you are planning on attending any post secondary institution you should make contact with them to determine their requirements and whether they will accept Enrolled or require Credit Earned.
