## "Near Neighbors" Go Fish

## Rules of the game:

- Decide who deals first. (Rock, paper, scissors)
- Dealer gives out 7 cards to each player.
- The dealer lays down all their near neighbor pairs and out loud says each fact.
  Example Say "3 + 5 = 8 because 3 + 3 = 6 and 2 more is 8" (or 5 + 5 = 10 and 2 less is 8) or "5 + 7 = 12 because 5 + 5 = 10 and 2 more is 12" (or 7 + 7 = 14 and 2 less is 12)
- All the other players lay down all their **near neighbors** and say out loud each fact and *how* they know the answer.
- Player to the left of the dealer goes first.
  - Ask any player for a number that is 2 bigger or 2 smaller than one of your cards. Ask "\_\_\_\_\_\_ do you have a \_\_\_\_\_?"
     (name of player) (number)
- If the card is given, lay down the near neighbor pair, say the fact (and how you got the answer) and go again. \*If the player does not say the fact out loud (example Say "8 + 10 = 18"), or how they got their answer, or says the sum incorrectly, he/she loses that pair to the person who catches their mistake.
- If the player asked does not have the card they say "Go Fish!" This means draw a card from the pile. Now the play goes to the next player.
- If a player runs out of cards, they need to pick up 5 cards from the pile.
- The point of the game is to pair up all your cards with a near neighbor.
- Jacks, Queens, and Kings are worth 10. Jokers are worth 11. Aces are worth 1.
- When all cards in the pile are gone, it's time to see who has the most pairs.
  Whoever has the most pairs wins the game!
