Use the following recipe, or your own, to make play dough. Use the play dough to practice making letters, numbers, or even sight words!

Play Dough

Ingredients:

1 cup Flour $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Salt $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Water

Food colouring for colour

Step 1: Combine salt and flour

Step 2: In a small bowl mix water and food colouring

Step 3: Mix together

*Allow your play dough to sit for an hour so it can form, then it will be ready for play!

*Store in the fridge for up to four weeks.




- Try to read with a family member for at least 30 minutes each day!
