
### Phys. Ed Class

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

## Legacy Project

As part of the year-long Legacy Project at C-NCS, students are working with Elders and First Nation Community members to incorporate Indigenous learning into the curriculum.

In January, students had the opportunity to learn the process and importance of basket making with Elder Victor Bear from Tobique First Nation. They also learned the significance of shakers and the water sound they make. The process to construct a buffalo hide shaker has many steps and can be difficult but, with the help of Elder Ken Paul from Kingsclear First Nation, students proudly painted their finished shakers.

One student commented that he finally sees the lesson on patience and hard work that the activity was teaching him. Thank-you from Ms. Harris, project contact, to Mr. Burrill, Ms. Bishop, Donna White, ASD-W First Nation Coordinator and the secondary team for their hard work in creating and incorporating engaging activities to help build global citizenship in our students!
