### Schedule

Classes begin every day at 8:15 am. Buses load at 2:50 pm Monday – Thursday. Elementary and Middle Level students are done at noon every Friday. High School students are done at 2:25pm every Friday except the fourth Friday of the month when they will be done at 12:00pm.

Supervision for students will begin at 8:00 am, **classes begin at 8:15am for students who are in Gr 3 to 12. K-2 students have breakfast and learning centres from 8:00-8:30 and then classes begin at 8:30.** Students must not be dropped off at school prior to 8:00. Students must be picked up promptly after school (2:50pm) if they are not going home on the bus. If for any reason students must leave school during the school day, a parent or legal guardian must come into the school to sign the student out at the office. To enter the building, visitors must press the call button to the left of the door, wait for admittance and report directly to the office. **Parents are not to go down the elementary hallway. Please check with the office upon arrival and the Administrative Assistant will page them to the office.**
