### Vaping

Vaping has arrived at Cambridge-Narrows Community School. We ask that you please talk to your children about the dangers of smoking and vaping. Vaping is the same as smoking and is NOT PERMITTED on school property, in the school or on busses. Please remind your children if they are caught smoking or vaping on school property there will be consequences.

Here is some important information about vaping:

- **Vaping can increase your exposure to harmful chemicals.**
- **Vaping can lead to nicotine addiction.**
- **The long-term consequences of vaping are unknown.**
- **Defective vaping products (especially batteries) may catch fire or explode, leading to burns and injuries.**

The ingredients typically found in vaping liquids include glycerol, flavors, propylene glycol and varying levels of nicotine. The long-term safety of inhaling these substances in vaping products is unknown and continues to be assessed.

The heating process can cause reactions and create new chemicals, such as formaldehyde. Some contaminants, such as metals, might also get into the vaping products and then into the aerosol.

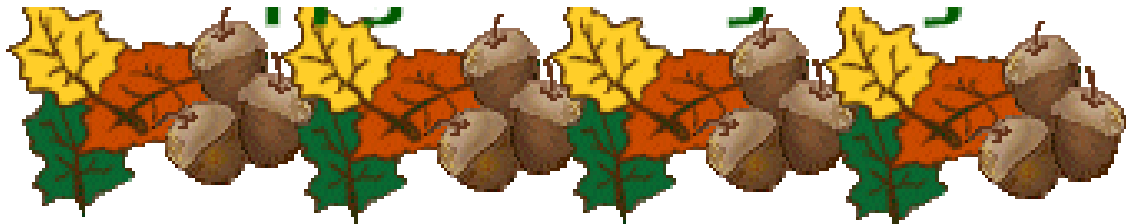
