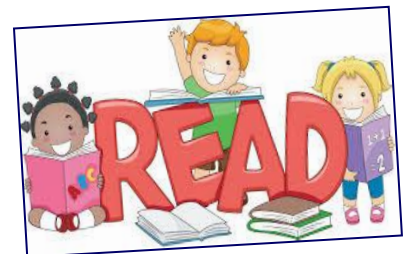

## Science – And Media Bias

Our final week in science for this year deals with a topic that is heavy, but extremely important for learners of all ages. Have you ever thought about how science is presented in the news? This week's topic is about how media outlets (news on TV, websites etc) inform the general public about science, and the political biases they have when presenting that information.

So, what is bias? And how can the media use it to influence public perceptions? Your exercise this week will have you using this website: <https://www.allsides.com/media-bias/media-bias-ratings>

You will find two news outlets, one that is "left" and one that is "right" (ask your parents what these two terms mean). For example, The New Yorker is listed as "left", and Breitbart News is listed as "right". Scroll down and use the "bias rating" under the "adjust filters" section to make finding an outlet easier. Next, pick one topic and search for it on both sites. Example of topics: Black Lives Matter, Climate change, Universal Basic Income etc. As you read each article take note of the language being used in each. Is the article trying to make you feel a certain way? Which bias (left or right) aligns with your own personal feelings and beliefs? And is it good or bad (or neither) for writers to influence the public by putting their own bias into articles? These are the questions you should be asking when you research.
