WOOKIE COOKIES

INGREDIENTS

- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup milk chocolate chips
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

PREPARATION

Preheat the oven to 375°F.

Put the flour, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon in a mixing bowl. Stir with the wooden spoon until well mixed. Set aside. Put the butter, brown sugar, and granulated sugar in another mixing bowl. Using the electric mixer set on high speed, beat together until well blended and creamy, about 3 minutes. (You can do this with a wooden spoon, but it will take longer.) Beat in the eggs and vanilla extract. Add the flour mixture and stir with the wooden spoon until blended. Stir in the chocolate chips.

Scoop up a rounded tablespoonful of the dough and drop onto a baking sheet. Repeat until you have used up all the dough. Be sure to leave about 1 inch between the cookies because they spread as they bake.

Using pot holders, put the baking sheets in the oven. Bake until golden brown, about 10 minutes.

Science

A Portrait of the Rebel as a Young Man

May the Fourth be with you! Pay tribute to your favourite Star Wars character by making their face into a constellation. You may also use this activity to display your favourite real-life constellation or create an entirely new constellation!

You will need:

Marker, Needle, Aluminium foil or a piece of Bristol board

Procedure:

This experiment is similar to carving a pumpkin. Draw your design using a marker, then poke holes along the lines you've drawn. Not too many holes though. If you use Aluminium foil remember it is very fragile and may tear. Wait until night, turn on the light in your room and put your creation in your window. Cover any exposed glass so that the only way light can escape your room is through the holes you've poked.

Now go outside and look at the constellation you've made!

Choice extension activity

Cut a thin, vertical slit into a piece of paper roughly 3mm by 50mm. Stand the piece of paper 15cm in front of a light source in an otherwise dark room. You should see a slice of light projected onto a wall if the paper is close enough to a wall. Black construction paper would work best here.
