Dear Potential Grad of the Class of 2021 and Family:

Congratulations! You are now well on your way to becoming a graduate with a Carleton North High School diploma. This year will be full of exciting memories and challenges as you prepare for life after Carleton North. At this meeting, you were given a [green sheet](#) with your graduation requirements you must complete to graduate by June with a CNHS High School Diploma. Also, you were provided with a copy of your historical grades and a checklist sheet to double check the graduation requirements yourself. **Please use this to check your graduation requirements. Also, please double check your schedule of courses to ensure you are registered in everything you need to graduate.**

This is an important time in your life with many important post-secondary decisions to be made. There are many things you should be doing now to help you with those decisions. Please use the CNHS Grade 12 Student Checklist ([blue stapled sheets](#)) as a guide to keep you organized and to plan for post-graduation. Right away, **check the admission requirements at the post-secondary institutions you may be considering. Ensure that you are registered in the mandatory high school courses needed to meet entrance requirements for your program of interest.** Contact schools to schedule visits for **tours and open houses** at schools that interest you. These may be virtual this year. Make an appointment with Mrs. Albright if you need any help with post-secondary information or applications.

Today you've also received a [pink form](#) (Parent/Guardian Consent/Release of Information Form) that must be checked off and signed to allow us to release any information (transcripts) to scholarship providers. **Please have this signed and return it to the secretaries as soon as possible.** We have also given you a [white sheet](#) that outlines the schedule of events for graduation this year. Please put it on the fridge so you **don't** forget the dates.

We have given you a pamphlet that summarizes [a number of](#) scholarships that were posted last year. Additional information about scholarships is summarized on another [purple sheet](#). Students will have other graduation meetings, including a scholarship tips meeting in November. Students will receive more information about this [at a later date](#).

Finally, you were given a copy of transcript which shows the courses you have completed to date. If you need a copy of your transcript to send to college or university, then you must request an official one at the office with the secretaries.

Everything given to you today, except for your personal information, will be posted on the CNHS website under the guidance tab. If you have questions or concerns about careers, applications, post-secondary schools, work, or other opportunities after high school, please see Mrs. Albright.

Please note: We are in the process of creating a 2020-2021 Grad Team on Microsoft Office 365. All grade 12 students are encouraged to check the Team regularly throughout the school year. Scholarship information and other important graduation information will appear here throughout the year. It will also be posted on the CNHS website under quick links – guidance.

This year, due to COVID, potential graduates must have 12 courses with either a passing grade or CR. They are also required to have 17 credits with a passing grade, CR or ENR on their transcript.

STUDENT: _____ requires ____ out of 12 credits (CR or a mark of 60% or above on your transcript) to graduate. Also required is ____ out of 17 credits (CR, a mark of 60% or higher or ~~ENR~~) on your transcript.

Welcome to the 2020-2021 school year! You are now a potential graduate.

Directions –Use the copy of your **historical grades** to find the grade 11 and 12 courses you have either passed, received a CR, or received an ENR. Then determine what other grade 11 or 12 courses you need to graduate.

Step 1 – Place a checkmark beside the 7 compulsory courses you have already passed (received above 60%, received a CR or received an ENR).

- *English 112 or 113 (2 credits, so check it twice if you passed it)
- English 122 or 123
- Math 11 (Financial and Workplace Math 110 or Foundations Math 110)
- Science (Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Human Physiology, Automotive Electrical Systems, or Intro to Electronics)
- Modern History 112 or 113
- Fine Arts or Life Role (Any grade 11 or 12 Music class, Visual Art 110, Graphic Art and Design, Outdoor Education, Wellness PE, Entrepreneurship, Nutrition, COOP, Individual Family Dynamics, Culinary Tech., Theatre Arts, Fashion Tech, any shop class, Goals, Growth & Grit, Leadership)

Step 2 – On your historical grades sheet, see all your grade 11 and grade 12 courses. Count up all the grades of CR or marks above 60% in the F1 Column. Below, list all the courses that you have received either a passing grade or a CR. **Remember, English 11 is 2 credits, so you will write that down twice. You need twelve courses with either CR or a mark of 60% or above.**

Example: 1. Media Studies 120 = 79% 2. Visual Arts 110 = CR

Step 3 – On your historical grades sheet, see all your grade 11 and grade 12 courses again. Below, write down all the courses for which you have received a passing grade, a CR or an ENR. **Remember, English 11 is 2 credits, so you will write that down twice. You need seventeen courses with either CR, a mark of 60% or above, or ENR.**

Example: 1. Financial Workplace Math 110 = 84% 2. Visual Arts 120 = CR 3. Canadian History = ENR

This scholarship list attempts to capture a selection of community, regional, and national scholarships available to students. The website is a working document and it will be revised on an ongoing basis. Please check for updates frequently. This list will also be posted on the CNHS website under the guidance – scholarships tab.

- 2) CNHS guidance will continue to post local (in-house/CNHS specific) awards **as they become available from April – June 2021**. These will be posted on the 2020-2021 Grad Team on Office 365 and on the CNHS website under the quick links – guidance – scholarships link. Students will also be made aware of these scholarships through announcements, the guidance bulletin board, and also the teachers of grade twelve students will notify students when the local CNHS specific scholarships are posted.
- 3) Students are also strongly encouraged to search college and university (post-secondary) websites for scholarships associated with specific institutions. Many post-secondary schools have a [one page](#) application form that can be filled out to apply to many scholarships, in addition to separate application forms for larger scholarships. It is important to be aware of this when applying for scholarships at colleges and universities. Some employers and organizations offer scholarships that are specific to them and not advertised through schools each year.

NEW PROGRAM ALERT - NBCC

Trades Foundations - two-year delivery, with students able to explore multiple trades in the first year and then move into a chosen trade in the second year. The move to a two-year program will be attractive to those students who are thinking about a trade but who are also uncertain about which trade would be the best fit.

Social Services Community Worker - This all-new program will combine skills in social work, behavioural sciences, and humanities to prepare graduates for work with families, groups, and communities. It will incorporate elements of the former Human Services and Child and Youth Care programs and will be designed to enable students to specialize in a specific area of Human Services, such as youth care or elder care. The Child and Youth Care and Human Services programs will no longer be accepting applications. There will be an exit point in the program after the 1st year and we will still have Special Admissions seats in the new program.
