Communication is an important key to a successful school year.

New staff: We welcome Jesse Clair, teacher, and Danielle Smith, Educational Assistant to our staff this year. We have 13 returning teachers, 2 returning EAs, as well as returning Admin Assistant, Library Worker and Custodians.

Custody Information: By law, schools are required to provide, on request from non-custodial parents, information about a student's education, except when a court order prohibiting access of a parent to a child exists.

If there is a current, valid court order prohibiting access to this child, the responsibility rests with the custodial parent to provide the school with a copy of this document. Please send in a copy of such a form if it exists or call Jane at the office to make other arrangements for our having a copy on file.

School Safety: Over the course of the next few weeks, we will be practising drills including evacuations, fire drills, school lock downs and evacuation to alternate site. Our alternate site is the Carleton Civic Centre and we occasionally walk from school to the Civic Centre by way of the NB Trail or Main Street sidewalk to practice this routine.

Contacting the School: If you call during the day, *please leave a message* and Jane will get back to you. She is sometimes away from her desk so she may not pick up when you call; however, she checks for messages each time she returns to her desk and will be sure to respond to your request.

Driveway Access: Students being driven to school should be dropped off at the front door after **7:45** am. Please enter on the 'McCain' side of the driveway and exit by the 'bridge' side. Between 8:00 and 8:30 and from 2:30 to 3:00, there should be no traffic circling the building.

On Time for School: Our instructional day begins at the **8:20 bell**. Students who arrive after that time are tardy for the day.

Cafeteria Service: The regular menu will start Monday, September 8th. Once the trends of what is liked and sells best become more obvious, we will update students and parents on any adjustments to the menu. **New** this year, Chartwells is featuring milk cards and meal cards which we hope will arrive in time for the Meet and Greet.

The cafeteria does not offer credit. If your child forgets lunch they can make toast or sandwich in the technology lab/kitchen from 12:18 to 12:28. Also note that the condiments and cutlery in the cafeteria are for those who are purchasing their lunch. Students who bring their lunch are also expected to bring their own cutlery.

Breakfast Program: FMS plans on continuing to offer breakfast to any and all students who wish to grab some toast and juice or other quick, healthy breakfast on the way to class in the morning. **We need your help!** We need **volunteers** who would be willing to come and help serve breakfast in order to keep this very important program up and running. We are also are hoping to identify any of you who have the **Certified Food Safety Course** to help us in monitoring our program. Please let Ms. Jane in the office if you can give of your time or expertise in this way.
