Summer Employment

The Student Employment and Experience Development (SEED) Program provides a centralized referral service for all Provincial Government and SEED funded summer employment positions. Applicants are referred for jobs on the basis of their education, skills, and location as identified on their application form. Employers are supplied a list of potential applicants. Students who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the fall are eligible to apply. Students can apply as of April 1st.

How to Apply:

The application form is available online at www.NBjobs.ca. Additional Job search resources are provided as part of the application. Once the application is submitted, the information will be directed to your local employment office. It will then be assessed for eligibility, and the summer placements will be distributed to eligible students until all the placements are allocated. It is recommended that students apply early. Selected students will receive information by email on how to proceed to connect with eligible employers. If not selected, they will be added to a waiting list.

Student Entrepreneurship Program

The Student Entrepreneurship component of the Student Employment and Experience Development Program (SEED) is a unique summer employment program. It offers interest-free loans to students who wish to create summer employment and gain valuable business experience by operating their own business. Retail shops, craftspeople, painting operations, computer companies, lawn care businesses and many other original ventures have received funding in the past. The Student Entrepreneurship component provides a guaranteed interest-free loan of up to \$3,000 to help students start a summer business that will create at least one full-time student summer job for themselves (minimum of 30 hours per week) and provide the applicant

with valuable entrepreneurial experience. If the loan has been repaid in full by October 15, up to one-third of the value of the loan may be reimbursed, provided all program regulations and requirements have been met. This program is for students who are pursuing post-secondary education full time in the fall. Further information can be found at www.gnb.ca/training.

Youth Employment Fund

The Youth Employment Fund provides an entry point to long term employment for unemployed individuals between 18-29 years of age who require a work experience opportunity. By placing an individual with an employer, the individual will gain work experience and develop skills through basic workplace training, mentoring and coaching. Graduating high school students, at least 18 years of age, who do not plan to attend postsecondary education and plan to enter the labour force immediately after high school may apply for this program after May 1. Please submit your information and a staff member from your local Post-Secondary Education, Training and Labour office will contact you to assist with the application process and determine your eligibility. The Student Financial Services Branch of the Department of Post-Secondary Education Training and Labour is pleased to announce the resumption of its annual high school presentations on the student financial assistance program, for New Brunswick high school students and their parents. An Educational Liaison Officer will be at Hartland Community School to host one of these presentations on May 9th, 2016 from 1:00pm to 2:00pm. These sessions are intended to provide details on the funding available to post-secondary students, explain the assessment process, and offer information for parents to help support students in preparation for their post-secondary studies. All grade 12 students planning to pursue post-secondary studies, as well as their parents are encouraged to attend. The presentation is approximately 30 minutes in length and is followed by Q & A.
