John Glass Invitational

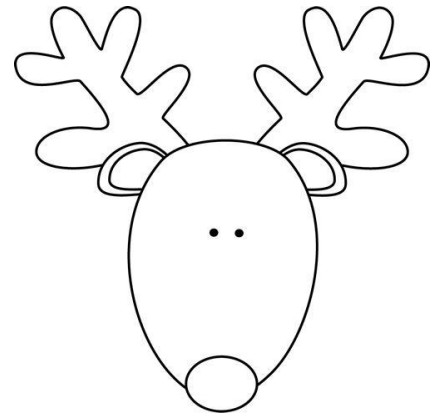
