Be Safe at School-COVID Updates and Reminders

Over that past month we have been increasingly aware as a province, and school community of the spread of the Coronavirus. Messages are often shared in class in on our morning announcements to help to keep each other safe at school. The latest version of the EECD's School Guideline for COVID is found in the Healthy and Safe Schools document. It reminds all of us of expectations for masks and hygiene in response to COVID. We require for all students and staff to have clean masks to be worn at school, and a personal water bottle for use. Do not send students to school if they are unwell, or if they are showing more than one symptom of COVID. Better to be safe than sorry! Seek help if your child has tested positive in a rapid test, or has been in contact with a COVID positive person. Follow the directions of Public Health to help keep each other safe.
