Dear Parents/Guardians of Students at Florenceville Elementary School:

As stated in my September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 letter to you, the Anglophone West School District Education Council (ASD-W DEC) voted in favor of engaging a sustainability study of Florenceville Elementary School, under the process of Provincial Policy 409: Multi-year Infrastructure Planning. The sustainability study of a school follows a process that includes three public meetings. Public Meeting #1 for Florenceville Elementary School (and Florenceville Middle School) was held on Saturday, October 26, 2019.

In addition to Florenceville Elementary and Middle Schools, Bristol Elementary School and Bath Community School are also being studied under the parameters of Provincial Policy 409.

Parents and members of the community are invited to attend the first public meeting in the consultation process on the sustainability of **Bath Community School and Bristol Elementary School**:
