





Open feedback for Option 1



“I had children go through FHES. The school is **over crowded**, has **poor air quality** and in some areas, is **literally crumbling.**”

“As a parent of kids who have come through Forest Hill and now Liverpool, the idea of a sweet little **K-1 school is endearing... and a nightmare of inconvenience.** My children will have attended 4 different schools by the end of their public education, with the **associated upheaval that goes with each transition.**”





Survey results for Option 2 (provide necessary repairs only)



Open feedback for Option 2



“Both Forest Hill and Liverpool are **bursting at the seams** and in need upgrades for years now as well as proper facilities. **I don't see renovations being able to honestly improve the facilities standards** for what is required in our current times. This is **unfair** for the children in this neighbourhood.”

“...I just don't wish to open a new school. I love our current school. Even if its aging, **it's small, which is the entire reason I purchased a home in this area... It's awful to have a school that large** and don't wish that for any student let alone my own children....”
