Earth Rangers will be presenting "Bring Back the Wild" on Thursday, November 10th. The presentation educates students on the challenges facing biodiversity today by focusing on four animals that we are helping to protect: The Monarch Butterfly, Plains Bison, Spotted Turtle and the Newfoundland Pine Marten.



During the presentation topics such as the Monarch Butterfly's incredible migration from Canada to Mexico, the legend of the Pine Marten and First Nations people in Canada, as well as an inspiring story from a passionate young scientist name Meghan who is helping save the Spotted Turtle from extinction.





The Animal Ambassadors will be the stars of the show and will introduce students to some amazing members of the Earth Rangers family such as; Cosmo, a ring tailed lemur that will amaze students with his leaping ability and Echo, the Barn Owl who will thrill audiences as he swoops silently overhead.

Reminder to Parents/Guardians:



For the safety of our students once again we are reminding parents and guardians of a few items.

Emergency Evacuation Procedure Information



School District 8 and Morna Heights School has a primary responsibility to ensure the safety of students and staff inside school buildings and while on school property. As a result, all schools in the district will be developing and practicing Emergency Procedures which include evacuation to an alternate site, external and internal lockdown procedures.

In the event that a school must be evacuated, the children will be taken to the KBM Club House and remain there until the situation has been assessed. If we are unable to return to the school we will contact all parents. Buses will operate from the KBM and walkers will be sent home. A school lockdown is initiated should a high risk incident involving weapons, hazardous chemical spill, severe weather warning, student/other intruder, etc. occur in the schools or on school property, or if there are circumstances in the vicinity of the school that could endanger the safety of students and staff.

In order for all students and staff to become familiar with the expectations during a lockdown, our school will begin practicing emergency lockdown procedures on a regular basis, as we do with fire drills. During these drills there will be signs posted on the entrance doors indicating that the school is in lockdown. The doors will be locked and no one will be permitted to enter or leave the school during these exercises. This is the same procedure that will be followed in a real situation.

Teachers will talk to their students and practice before we do a school wide exercise. These lockdown procedures only take a few minutes to practice.
