## **Grade 6 Provincial Assessment:**

From May 27<sup>th</sup> to June 7<sup>th</sup>, grade 6 students will be writing the Provincial Assessments. The students will be assessed on English Reading, French, French Reading, Math and Science. This assessment is part of a system of assessments in Literacy, Math and Science throughout elementary, middle and high school.

The month of May is Food Allergy Awareness with May 29<sup>th</sup> being **Purple Day** in order to increase awareness about Food Allergies. A food allergy occurs when the body's immune system sees a certain food as harmful and reacts by causing symptoms. Allergic reactions can involve the skin, mouth, eyes, lungs, heart, gut and brain.
