

- This is a great opportunity for students to partake in an election and to become participating voters in the future!


PICTURE DAY

Canteens are located in the lunchroom and on the top floor by the balcony every Friday! Items are \$1 or \$2.




ATHUS CONGRATULATIONS!



Interesting fact: I once won all the prizes in a pumpkin carving contest by carving Garfield's face on one pumpkin and stacking two pumpkins to feathered owl.


