<u>Autism Awareness</u>- April is Autism Awareness Month. In recognition of this, here are five common myths and facts about children diagnosed with autism:

- Myth- Autism is caused by mutations in only one gene.
 Fact- Autism is caused by a combination of genetic and environmental factors. To date, variations in close to 300 genes have been associated with Autism.
- Myth- Vaccinations can cause Autism.
 Fact- There is no link between vaccinations and Autism.
- Myth- The brain of a person with Autism is dramatically different from the brain of a neurotypical person.
 Fact- It takes experts carefully measuring small changes to find even the most remote differences.
- Myth- Autism can be diagnosed in blood and urine samples.
 Fact- Autism is diagnosed using an established set of behaviour evaluations.
- 5. Myth- Autism is a rare disease affecting very few individuals. Fact- Autism is the second most prevalent neuro development disorder among children... "Based on 2015 data, it is estimated that 1 in 66 Canadian children and youth ages 5-17 have been diagnosed with ASD." <u>HPV Clinic</u>- After several postponements, Public Health plans to host an HPV Clinic for our Grade 7s on April 12th. Also, any Grade 8student eligible to receive the second HPV dosage will be invited to attend (Public Health would have a record of this) Finally, eligible students in Grade 7 and 8 may also receive their first or second Covid vaccination at this clinic. Grade 7s need to hand in their consent forms before Wednesday, April 6th.

<u>Provincial Assessments</u>- Bayside students will be participating in Provincial Assessments from April 20th until May 2nd. Students will be assigned the following virtual assessments:

Grade 6- English Language Arts (Reading) and Science

Grade 7- French Second Language Reading and Math

Grade 8- Science
