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## Bayside Bulletin- March 2022

<u>Greetings</u>- As we approach March Break, we are happy to see some of the restrictions we faced daily due to Covid-19 have been relaxed. We are waiting for further direction from Pubic Health about the next set of restrictions to be lifted on March 14<sup>th</sup>. It has been a tough two years and we appreciate your cooperation in having your children prepared to come to school during a pandemic and following the safety expectations laid out for students and staff.

<u>Home Reports</u>- The second home report will be issued on April 11th. This term, we will again offer Parent-Teacher Interviews in a virtual format. Booking information will be shared shortly before reports cards are issued. Our hope is that parents of children who are struggling academically will take advantage of this time and be part of the intervention plan for their child's success at school. The scheduled dates for Parent-Teacher Interviews are Wednesday evening, April 13<sup>th</sup>, from 4:00- 7:00pm and Thursday, April 14th, from 9:00- 11:00am. Students will not have school on April 14th as teachers will be conducting parent interviews in the morning and attending professional development activities in the afternoon.

<u>March 16th</u>- All students will be invited to attend a Virtual Anti-Racism Presentation hosted by our Partners at Get Real.

<u>March 25th</u>- There will be no school for students on Friday, March 25th, as teachers have professional learning on this day. Teachers will also be preparing home reports.

<u>Specialty Changes</u>- With the beginning of Term 3 on March 28th, students will begin a new specialty (either Music, Art, or Tech). Students going to Art during the last term are asked to have a sketchbook, pencils, eraser, glue stick, pencil crayons/markers for the first class.

<u>Enrichment Day</u>-Our annual Enrichment Day activities will be held on March 4th. Students will have the opportunity to participate in fun events which extend beyond the classroom. Bingo, on-line trivia, Breakout, Minute to Win It, and Tug of War are the scheduled activities. Many students will win gift cards for their favorite restaurants or stores.
