It has been a crazy couple of months for Bayside Athletics as we currently have 8 teams/clubs going right now between volleyball, football, cheer, track and running club. We have waited 2 years to have these opportunities offered to our students so hopefully they get out there to help Bayside pride and success.

Volleyball-

JV Boys our JV boys' team is in a circuit with all Varsity teams but are quickly learning the game and having success. Their early introduction to volleyball will pay off next year when they move onto Varsity so keep up the good work.

Varsity Boys are currently 6-0 in regular season and just got back from the STU tournament where they finished second in their pool, earning them a place in Tier 1, but got knocked off by the 2nd ranked team in the tournament. They head back to Fredericton for Provincials this month and prepare for regional playoffs mid-May.

The girls also hosted their Bayside Annual Volleyball tournament thanks to Mr. Manuel and Mrs. Gillis. It was awesome seeing 10 teams jammed into the gym with all the energy and excitement again. This was very evident in a 3 set, extra point match for the finals between Bayside Varsity and QMS where the games went back and forth before QMS closed the final set 18-16 in a 15-point set.

We need roughly 10-14 students per team to fill all the events (each event has 2 participants and 1 spare) so get your Bronco to help Bayside succeed in 2022. Typically, our team is made up of 70-90 students. This will be the finale for Mr. Shephard and Mr. Manuel who have coached this team year in and year out "SO LET'S GO BRONCOS".
