SORA is a provincial eLibrary created by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development which provides students (via their child's school username and password) with access to a wide range of eBooks, audiobooks, and read-alongs, which will appeal to a variety of student interests and reading levels. The collection includes a mix of fiction, nonfiction, French language books, and culturally- inclusive books, including those with Indigenous content. Books are also chosen to ensure a range of representation for inclusive environments: LGBTQ2SI,

neurodiversity, and family context.

Books can be checked in and out-- both inside and outside of school--on school devices as well as personal devices.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

The following are not permitted in school:

- Dresses and shorts which are shorter than mid-thigh
- Tops which do not cover from shoulder to waist: tops and bottoms must meet
- Any attire which is extremely low cut or which exposes undergarments.
- Hats (please remove upon entry)
- Items referring to illegal drugs.
- Clothing with profanity or suggestive words or imagery.

The dress code will extend to all school activities and functions including cocurricular and extra-curricular trips, dances, fun days and any other school related activities.

COMING TO & FROM SCHOOL



Buses: Be sure to listen to the radio in the morning for late bus announcements, visit the ASD-S website or follow ASD-S on Twitter

<u>STUDENT PICK UP/DROP OFF:</u> Students must be picked up and dropped off by the middle school playground before and after school.

Picking up students in front of the school increases the risk of injury as students may be running between buses to meet parents.

Students getting out of cars in the parking lot increases the chances of injury. If you are dropping off your child at the school, they should be arriving **no earlier than 8:10am** as there is no teacher on duty before this time.
